The **Aerial Display** by our Singapore Air Force (SAF) pilots shows off their skills in flying fighter jets in special formations.



It is an extra special **Birthday** this year because we are marking Singapore's 60th year of independence.



Changi Airport is often voted as the best airport in the world.



Chilli Crab has been called Singapore's national dish because it is like our nation's melting pot of multiethnic influences:
Malay spices, Indianstyle curry, Chinese ingredients (e.g. soy sauce, man tou) and Western ingredients (e.g. ketchup).



The Toa Payoh **Dragon Playground** was built in 1979 and is one of the few remaining ones in Singapore.



The **Durian** is the nickname of Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay because of its spiky roof.



We have strict rules about public **Fireworks**, which can only be used during special events like National Day. Singapore does not allow people to set off fireworks without permission.



Each element on the **Flag** has important meaning. For example, the five stars stand for five important values we want to live by: democracy, peace, progress, justice and equality.



The **Flypast** is a special show put on by the SAF, including a huge state flag carried by helicopters that fly across the island.



At **Gardens by the Bay**, you can find the
Supertrees, which are
tall vertical gardens
covered with over 200
types of plants.



About eight in 10 Singaporeans (76.4 per cent) live in **HDB flats**.



Kaya Toast is a favourite breakfast for many Singaporeans. Like many of our local dishes, it has multicultural roots: Chinese (Hainanese), Malay, Eurasian and Peranakan.



The **Merlion** is a mythical animal that represents our country's history: the head of a lion (from our old name, 'Singapura', which means 'Lion City') and the body of a fish (from our beginning as a fishing village and our maritime history).



The **Milo Dinosaur** is said to have been invented by local Indian–Muslim eateries in the mid–1990s, around the same time the first *Jurassic Park* movie came out.



The MRT network has six lines now: North-South Line (red), East-West Line (green), North-East Line (purple), Circle Line (yellow), Downtown Line (blue) and Thomson-East Coast Line (brown). More stations and lines are being built to connect to more places.



Our national flower is an **Orchid** called the Vanda Miss Joaquim, a hybrid of two flowers.



The **Parachute** at the National Day Parade is the popular skydiving display by the Red Lions or SAF Parachute Team. This year, they'll be parachuting into the Padang and Marina Bay.



The **Parade** is an important part of our National Day celebrations. Participants include members of our army, navy, air force, police, civil defence force, organisations and schools.



The **Singapore Flyer** is as tall as 31 giraffes stacked together! It takes 30 minutes to complete a full rotation.
