Management:

- Conduct environment scan and be familiar with the space.
- Define the boundaries that the children could explore within their supervision.
- Remove sharp and potential hazards that could cause harm to the children.

How to make it happen:

Settling in: 15 minutes -Stones hunting

- 1. Bring children for a short 5-8 minute walk in the environment where there are stones.
- 2. Interact with children on what they can see in the environment.
- 3. Share with children that they will be doing stone painting later.
- 4. Have children to pick a stone for their painting activity.

Main activity: 20 minutes

- 1. Place the big piece of paper or cloth on the floor.
- 2. Invite each child to put on their smock.
- 3. Share and demonstrate to children on how they can dip the stone into the paint and paint it on the paper.
- 4. Allow children to choose their own colours.
- 5. Encourage children to share their thoughts and feelings about their painting.
- 6. Acknowledge children's thinking and feelings and encourage them to continue with their exploration.

Packing up: 10 minutes

- 1. Pack up time Get children to place their stones in a pail and wash their hands at the sink.
- 2. Educarers will collect all the materials and bring it back to class.
 - * Note to Educarers: Please wash the stones and place them in the classroom. If not, please place it back at the park. As it is a natural material in our environment, please do not throw it away.
