## How to use this book!

While going through the story of August and Kevin as they imagine a futuristic Singapore, your children can also fill in the colours on pages 6, 7 and 12, to make their story more colourful.

At the end of the story, let your children reflect on what they love about Singapore, draw it out on page 13 and describe it to everyone. Reiterate the core values of our nation by explaining to your children what those values look like in action when they complete the tracing of the missing letters on page 14. You will find those values familiar, as they are featured in our Singapore Pledge! Are there other values that you think are important to being a Singaporean (e.g. kindness, empathy, Volunteerism, inclusiveness)? Share those with your children

and how they can exhibit those values too, in their

little ways, every day.

Finally, using recycled materials that you can gather from home, follow the instructions on the last page to make your own shakers before joining in our nation's birthday celebration on 9 August!







#### **DIY Shakers**

Use recycled materials to make and decorate your own shakers to cheer for the National Day Parade on 9th August!



#### WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

Cardboard rolls, egg cartons, tissue boxes, cardboard boxes, colour paper, decorative tapes, masking tape, double-sided tape, gluestick, scissors, pens and markers, rice, beans

#### SHAKER 1

- Cut the egg carton into its individual units, trim off the edges, leaving only the cup.
  - 2. Pour the rice or beans into one cup, seal it by attaching another cup on top.
    - 3. Decorate with NDP colours!

#### SHAKER 2

 Cut the coloured paper according to the length and circumference of the cardboard roll. It should cover the whole cardboard roll.

- 2. Next, cut out 2 more similar rectangles but with 1/4 length, in different colours.
- Stick them onto the cardboard roll as seen.
- Trace the top and bottom roll and cut out the shapes.
- 5. Use the masking tape to attach the shapes, add rice or beans into the shaker before sealing it.
- 6. Decorate with NDP colours!


